1. What Are Cookies?

Cookies are small text files placed on your device when you visit a website. They help websites remember your preferences and understand how you use the site. Cookies cannot run programmes or deliver viruses to your device.

This policy explains what cookies we use on the Painters in Pubs landing page, why we use them, and how you can control them.

2. Our Use of Cookies

The Painters in Pubs landing page is a simple registration and information page. We use a minimal number of cookies, outlined below.

2.1 Strictly Necessary Cookies

These cookies are essential for the page to function correctly. They do not require your consent under PECR.

- **Session cookies** — temporary cookies that expire when you close your browser, used to maintain form state during registration
- **Security cookies** — used to protect against cross-site request forgery (CSRF) where applicable

2.2 Analytics Cookies (if enabled)

If we use an analytics service such as Google Analytics to understand how visitors use our page, cookies will be set to collect anonymised information, including:

- Pages visited and time spent on the page
- How you arrived at our page (e.g. direct link, social media)
- General location data (country/city level — not precise location)

These cookies are non-essential and require your consent before being set. You will be asked for consent via our cookie banner when you first visit the page.

If Google Analytics is in use, you can opt out using the Google Analytics Opt-out Browser Add-on available at: tools.google.com/dlpage/gaoptout

2.3 Third-Party Cookies

If our landing page embeds content from third-party services (such as maps or social media widgets), those services may set their own cookies. We have no control over these. Please refer to the relevant third-party privacy policies for more information.

3. Cookie Consent

In accordance with the Privacy and Electronic Communications Regulations (PECR), we will ask for your consent before placing any non-essential cookies on your device. A cookie banner will appear on your first visit.

You can:

- **Accept all cookies** — allows us to use analytics and any other non-essential cookies
- **Accept essential cookies only** — we will only use strictly necessary cookies
- **Change your preferences** — you can update your cookie preferences at any time by clicking the cookie settings link in the footer

Refusing non-essential cookies will not affect your ability to register for our events.

4. Managing Cookies in Your Browser

You can also control cookies directly through your browser settings. Here is how to do so in common browsers:

- **Google Chrome:** Settings > Privacy and security > Cookies and other site data
- **Mozilla Firefox:** Settings > Privacy & Security > Cookies and Site Data
- **Safari:** Preferences > Privacy > Manage Website Data
- **Microsoft Edge:** Settings > Cookies and site permissions > Cookies and data stored

Please be aware that blocking all cookies may affect the functionality of some websites, including our registration form.

- UK General Data Protection Regulation (UK GDPR)
- Privacy and Electronic Communications Regulations 2003 (PECR) as amended
- Guidance from the Information Commissioner's Office (ICO)
